Volunteering is Addictive: Recharging Your Job Search

From the first days of training until the final days of the COS conference, we were told that every Peace Corps volunteer tended to go through an “emotional cycle.” You all know it and probably had the line graph in your medical handbook to remind you when you forgot. Yet during those final days in-country and traveling afterwards, I couldn’t foresee falling into that rut that so many people talked about. I was busy with so many things to do: pack, meet friends for one last dinner or coffee, ship things home, coordinate travel plans, and wade through the sea of paperwork. Thinking ahead, I also knew there was a pile of things waiting for me to handle upon my homecoming. But one month after arriving home, there I was, puttering around my parents’ house and watching marathons of “Top Chef.” I had acclimated back into my life in the US in the sense that my life was in order on paper. But emotionally, I was finding it hard to transition from a life in Bulgaria filled daily with work and schedules, which I had worked two years to build, to life back in the US where I had to start anew.

Then one night, I got a call from my mom saying that my cousin’s young son had decided he was Superman and had catapulted himself down a flight of stairs, breaking both his fibula and tibia. As I sat next to my cousin in the ER waiting room, she asked me whether I would stay with her and help take care of him.

That was the turning point. For the next month, I tag-teamed the duties of driving the kids to school, carrying Max around the house and teaching him how to read to keep pace with his classmates. For the first time since I had left Peace Corps, I felt I had a purpose again. This is an extreme example, but to me it demonstrates that continuing to serve others in some capacity can provide the motivation to move forward. As a result, once I left my cousin’s house, I jumped into the job search and shortly thereafter found a position. I haven’t stopped volunteering, however, and I continue to volunteer on the weekends at a nursing home and a local food aid program. It helps keep me sane as I transition back into the fast-paced world that is DC.

People always say that volunteering for the Peace Corps was a life-changing experience. You learn a new culture and language and work together with your community to fill whatever need they have identified. For many, it’s a chance to be independent and learn about yourself and what you’re capable of accomplishing. All of this is true, but I also think there is a fundamental change that happens to volunteers. Your outlook on life and how you approach it changes after those two years. As a volunteer you asked yourself, “What is the need? What can I do to improve the situation and make an impact, and how can I take a more active role in my personal growth?” The work wasn’t always easy and you had your moments of sadness and disappointment (possibly combined with fleas or an amoeba!), but deep down you knew that you were making a small difference and, in the process, growing as a person. And that growth impacted how you subsequently chose to live your life.

I like to joke with friends that volunteering is like skydiving or tattooing, i.e. it is extremely

addictive. But it's true. As a Peace Corps volunteer, you have had the unique opportunity to volunteer at a grassroots level and become a member of your host community. Volunteering becomes a personal experience, one that you share with those you teach and work with daily. It's more than just giving your time and skills; you learn just as much, if not more, from those that you work alongside. Once you've tasted that, it's hard to give up entirely. In a way, I think that commitment and that desire to make an impact is what drives so many former volunteers in their careers. Whether it's directly working for the Peace Corps, the government, an NGO, or a private corporation, RPCVs bring along a unique set of technical and "soft" skills and a determination to succeed despite challenges they may face. So it's no surprise that so many RPCVs remain active volunteers within their communities following their service. It's something that was a large part of their lives and something that has inherently shaped them into the person they are today—and the person they want to continue fostering.

Looking back to that night when my cousin asked me to help, I had no idea I would be where I am today: working to help create the U.S. Asia Center, forwarding the think tank's goals of improving both the

lives of Asian Americans and U.S. relations with Asia. Life moves by at an extremely fast clip. Like many of you, though, I still remember the food that I ate during my Peace Corps service (and just can't reproduce as well as the *babas* [grandmothers] I knew did), the amazing sights that I saw, and especially the unforgettable friends and memories that I made. Remembering those times, and then taking action by volunteering again, helps stoke the fire inside. It feeds the idealism and the drive to make an impact. Especially now, with challenges for so many communities across the entire country, this continuation of service is something that we can't abandon and something we need to encourage.

Volunteering will always be a part of my life, whether it's going every week to a nursing home, doing a river clean-up, or lending a neighbor a hand when they need help carrying groceries. I know this feeling is shared by many returned Peace Corps Volunteers. As RPCVs we can show that service doesn't end with our COS date—it's a lifelong commitment and possibly even a way to reconnect with ourselves and provide the motivation to move forward.

Angela An is a 2007 recipient of the President's Volunteer Service Award. From 2004 to 2006, Angela served as a Peace Corps volunteer in the Secondary Education program in Bulgaria, where she taught English and In-

formation and Communication Technology to students age 12 to 18 at school in a remote mountain town. In addition, she helped to organize a summer leadership camp for 40 youth from throughout the country called Camp G.L.O.W.—Girls Leading Our World. Angela is currently an active volunteer at Sunrise Assisted Living Facility, and helps deliver groceries for home-bound senior citizens with Food for All.
