## A New Twist to Sharing Our Peace Corps Stories

Once upon a time, sharing Peace Corps experiences abroad meant taking pictures and showing projector slide shows to our friends and family. Today, there are many dynamic avenues to share our life and work as Peace Corps Volunteers with our friends, family, and community. Returned and currently serving Peace Corps Volunteers and our families are using information and communication technologies (ICT) regularly to engage in the Peace Corps' Third Goal. The most popular medium for carrying out Third Goal activities include using e-mail, cell phones, and computer calls, creating online videos, blogs, websites, and using social networking sites.

### Direct Chat and E-mail

To reach a reliable phone to call home in my early days of service in Niger, I had to walk seven kilometers in the sandy Sahel to reach a paved road and then take a bush taxi for two hours to get to the big city in my region. This was in late 2003. By 2004, I wised up and purchased a cell phone just as the cellular trend was becoming

popular in my part of West Africa. Now, many PCVs have cell phones to connect with folks in the U.S. and to make coordinating projects with local collaborators and host country Peace Corps staff easier.

Several PCVs have participated in Peace Corps-sponsored international phone calls with their World Wise Schools Correspondence Match classrooms to celebrate the agency's anniversary during past Peace Corps Weeks. You can hear some of these recorded calls as podcasts through Volunteer Voices (<http://www.peacecorps.gov/www/multimedia/podcasts/>). Other PCVs have independently arranged overseas phone calls with their Correspondence Match classrooms in the U.S. Depending on the phone card purchased, a \$5 card in the U.S. could provide around 20 minutes of chat time.

A small number of PCVs receive international calls from the U.S. via Internet to give phone presentations to student groups, sending their photos ahead of time as e-mail attachments. While Volunteers continue to send mail the old-fashioned way, emailing has

become one of the most efficient and cost-effective ways for many to communicate with family, friends, and others about their Peace Corps experience.

### Web Presence

Go to any online search engine and type in your choice of host country, "Peace Corps," "blog," "website," or "friends of" and you will see a plethora of listings. Engaging in the Third Goal no longer restricts us to returning to the U.S. to share our experiences in front of a live audience. Many PCVs are directly sharing (and documenting) their entire Volunteer experience to give the world an intimate glimpse of what working in the Peace Corps is like through blogging.

Others create informative websites to rally the Peace Corps community and reach out as a collective group to Americans about their Peace Corps experience. You will find many country- and state-specific RPCV groups online. Family members of PCVs also create websites and online meet-up groups to connect with one another and share the Volunteer
