OUR HISTORY

In 1961, United States President John F. Kennedy established the Peace Corps to promote world peace and friendship by challenging Americans to live and work in developing countries. Our mission and three goals remain as important today as they were at the time of the founding of the Peace Corps.

PEACE CORPS IN MACEDONIA

Macedonia is consistently one of the top countries selected for Volunteer service. The Peace Corps was established here in 1996 by invitation of the Government of Macedonia. Since then 735 Volunteers have worked with schools, local municipalities, civil society organizations, and public institutions to meet the diverse needs of communities throughout the country. As an acknowledgment of the importance of their work and the dedication of our Volunteers and staff, the President of Macedonia awarded Peace Corps with the Order of Merit for Macedonia in 2014. Peace Corps Macedonia has active Memoranda of Understanding with the Ministry of Education and Science, Ministry of Local Self Government, Ministry of Labor and Social Policy, Agency for Youth and Sports, and key NGO networks.

PROJECTS

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The Community Development (CD) projects with a focus on youth development, supports communities and organizations in effectively managing sustainable community development. Peace Corps collaborates with non-governmental organizations, local municipalities and public institutions throughout Macedonia. Volunteers and their local counterparts prioritize activities which:

- Improve planning, financial sustainability, and internal management and build staff capacity for project design, management, and service delivery
- Support organizations in assessing community needs and building strategic partnerships
- Train people in community engagement, life skills, and inclusion and raise community awareness of people with special needs
- Co-facilitate and organize clubs, classes, and camps for leadership development of young people

TEACHING ENGLISH

Volunteers have been working in primary and secondary public schools throughout the country since 1996 with an emphasis on rural and marginalized communities. Volunteers work on the following activities:

- Improve English instruction in the schools through student-centered methods
- Increase student success in English language learning
- Assist English teachers with special needs students in the classroom
- Provide on-going teacher training
- Facilitate English clubs and extracurricular activities including spelling bees, sports, and Model UN

SPECIAL NEEDS

Peace Corps Volunteers with experience, skills, and education in special needs work are placed in community organizations to:

- Work with educators on creating and implementing daily activities, resources, and new methodologies
- Work with individuals and their parents and support vocational skills development
- Train local youth to volunteer and work with special needs populations
- Facilitate life skills development
